WeatherCal

Do you look up weather forecasts on the web? Do you use iCal as your computer calendar? If you answered “yes” to both questions you may want to check out WeatherCal, a nifty little app from Bare Bones Software.

WeatherCal adds a preference pane that integrates information from the Weather Underground web site into iCal. In the preference pane, you enter the name or zip code of the locations whose forecasts you wish to see in iCal. Each location is added to iCal as a separate calendar, and each day’s forecast appears as a separate calendar event. In the screenshot below, you can see that I added forecasts for Windsor, ME.

According to Bare Bones, each calendar shows forecasts for the current day and the four following days. My experience is less consistent. The screenshot below shows forecasts for the current day (April 5) and the five following days. When I launch iCal, WeatherCal frequently shows the previous day’s forecast as well, until it gets its

bearings straight. These quirks aside, the mini-forecasts are tremendously useful. Each calendar event consists of an icon, a text snippet and hi/low temps. Double-clicking an event allows you to launch the Weather Underground web page to view the full forecast for the designated location. Tastes may differ, but I find Weather Underground to be far superior to the Weather Channel or National Weather Service sites. An added bonus is that your WeatherCal calendars sync via MobileMe to any other Mac, the MobileMe web app, or an iPhone or iPod Touch. At a cost of only \$10, WeatherCal is a bargain. A 30-day free trial is available. ☀
